In March, 1952 - when stereo photography was on everyone's mind - the Chicago Lighthouse for the Blind sponsored a "Snow Ball", an annual fund-raising event. A feature of the intermission was an invitational exhibition of 3-D photography. Well-known personalities, including actor Harold Lloyd and the drugstore chain's Myrtle Walgreen, were invited to exhibit. Many members of the Jackson Park Camera Club's 3- D section also exhibited.

The "Snow Ball" became the foundation stone of the Chicago Stereo Camera Club. A group of stereographers under the guidance of Robert L. McIntyre, Camera Editor of the Chicago Tribune, organized the club with hosting the Chicago Lighthouse International Exhibition of Stereo Photography as one of its primary purposes. The club joined the Photographic Society of America with the result that shows had to be conformed to meet PSA's rigid exhibition standards. Workshop parties were held often and club members attended not only to participate but to support, serve and cheer those who were doing the work. At public presentations, ladies of the club wore gowns and the gentlemen dressed accordingly, a sign of the lofty position the club held in Chicago society.

Today, the Chicago Lighthouse International Exhibition of Stereo Photography is proud to be listed as one of the longest continuing contributors to the Chicago Lighthouse.

Since 1906, The Chicago Lighthouse, Servicing the Blind, Visually Impaired, Disabled and Veteran Communities has been creating opportunities to enable these people to have equal access to education and employment.

Housed under its roof at 1850 W. Star requirements are:

excel to Star levels

1 STAR - at least 18 acceptances with at least 6 titles.

2 STARS - at least 36 acceptances with at least 12 titles.

3 STARS - at least 72 acceptances with at least 24 titles.

4 STARS - at least 144 acceptances with at least 48 titles. 5 STARS - at least 288 acceptances with at least 96 titles.

Master Awards: After achieving the 5 Star Rating, 75 acceptances from 25 different and new 3D images are required for each master level. The Recognition of Photography Awards are the Distinctions offered for members who have extensive exhibition records and

PSA Distinctions: PPSA - Proficiency, EPSA - Excellence, MPSA - Master, and GMPSA - Grand Master.

PSA recognizes individuals and clubs for their exceptional service with PSA Service Awards.

PSA Honors: APSA - Associate, FPSA - Fellow, Hon. PSA - Honorary Membership, Hon. FPSA - Honorary Fellow

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
